






Dress Code—SCDC

Appropriate dress while at the conference for event competition, special interest sessions and general sessions is Business Attire. Participants not adhering to the dress code may be disqualified, asked to return to their hotel room, and will not be allowed on the conference stage.

SCDC—Professional Business Attire During Competitive Events and On Stage

DECA Business Dress Code but no DECA blazer, sport coat, or jacket required.

SCDC—Business and General Sessions

DECA Business Dress Code but no DECA blazer, sport coat, jacket, tie or scarf required.

SCDC—Business Casual

DECA Business Dress Code for Business and General Sessions but no socks required.

SCDC—After Hours and Events Outside of SCDC Venue

Adhere to school dress code, no revealing clothing.

SCDC—Specific Events

When a different dress code is necessary based upon the events in which a student will be participating, the dress code will be communicated prior to the event.



DECADRESS TO IMPRESS

DRESS CODE WHEN APPEARING BEFORE JUDGES AND ON-STAGE



When judging adherence to the dress code, DECA directs advisors, teachers and chaperones to use observation as the tool for assessing compliance. It is inappropriate to touch a student or their clothing as a means of determining adherence to the dress code. DECA members who are not appropriately dressed will have a reasonable opportunity to meet the dress code prior to seeing a judge or being allowed on stage.
